The Encyclopedia of Women and Islamic Cultures is an innovative, interdisciplinary, comparative, global project. Our goal is not only to capture this exciting moment in the field of women's studies, but to break new ground in naming, framing, and analyzing the issues and to help set the agenda for future research.

The print edition of EWIC, published by Koninklijke Brill N.V., was completed in early 2008. Print EWIC offered six volumes, 2,000,000 words, 1,246 articles covering all facets of life for which we could find research on women and Islamic cultures all over the world, written by 907 scholars from all disciplines. Each contributor has been assigned a Routing Editor (see above) who will be the first to read your entry. We invite you to read sample articles in the EWIC Preview, available as a PDF on the EWIC website (<http://sjoseph.ucdavis.edu/ewic/>). Brill will offer EWIC Online authors a 35% discount on one Brill publication and a PDF of your article.

We ask you to fill out the Scholars Template and give us permission to publish it in the EWIC Scholars Database (<http://sjoseph.ucdavis.edu/ewic>). The database is a searchable network of experts on women and Islamic cultures designed to assist students, scholars, NGO's, foundations and agencies in connecting with researchers in this dynamic field.

We are delighted you have joined us in the EWIC project to help us pioneer in this cutting edge field of research.
